# HISTORY OF NEGOTIATIONS FOR "S. S. PHYLLIS WHEATLEY" REVEALED FOR THE FIRST TIME!

Fellow Men of the Negro Race, Greeting:

It becomes my duty as President General of the Universal Negro Improvement Association—the movement that seeks the liberation of the entire Negro race industrially, commercially, socially, religiously and politically—to bring to your attention certain things bearing upon the difficulties, embarrassments and ultimate rise of great movements, such as will be encountered by our own organization in our efforts to reach the pinnacle of success.

### An Upward Struggle

Every race and nation that has struggled upward has had to do so amidst the setbacks and discouragements and villainy of some of their own people. Naturally, therefore, the Universal Negro Improvement Association will not escape a like experience. Since the advent of our movement into the activities of the world, great have been the attractions and inducements to many who have been mere self-seekers and opportunists in finding a way into the circle of our mighty cause.

### Conscienceless Grafters

Every successful movement carries with it at some time or other a certain number of self-seeking parasites to whom nothing appeals but that which they can gain for themselves. The attachment of these persons are not confined only to movements, but to governments also. We have had grafters in governments, in corporations and in organizations who have so often placed such governments, corporations and organizations in difficulties. In this case the Universal Negro Improvement Association, and especially its auxiliary corporation, the Black Star Line, have suffered through the skillful maneuvering of a class of men whose souls and consciences are positively dead, even though they live.

# Perfidious Exploitation

The idea of money appeals so much to some men that in the acquisition of is they will murder their mothers-anyone, even an entire race-although they are numbers of that race. The Negro race has even since emancipation been . suffering from that perfidious exploitation that has caused it to become almost stagmant in the great purpose of life. A great resurrection in the race came in the advent of the Universal Negro Improvement Association, when a universal tovival took place among the rour hundred millions. Men and women of the ace everywhere longed for the new light, and in the sweeping success of this Enighty movement an opportunity was presented to dozens of those who were called to leadership to misuse their power and to divert to their own personal benefit all that should have been done in the interest of the race. In the conflict between right and wrong those who stood for the right in the cause of the Negro became open enemies of those who steed for the wrong. This division has escated an opposition to the work of the Universal Negro Improvement Asso-Cation, fostered by a group of dishonorable and discredited men scattered in different parts. Their work of destruction is becoming more visible from day to day, and it is good fortune that has led us to discover, see and know some of them, thereby rendering ourselves able to cope with the situation.

# An Inter-State Campaign

Firste are a number of Negroes, well organized and scattered between New York, Chicago, Philadelphia and Washington, who have entered into an agreement by which they would unitedly, yet in a separate and distinct way, carry out a campaign of opposition against the work of the Universal Negro Improvement Association and its auxiliary, the Black Star Line, for the purpose of destroying the usefulness of this great cause of human liberty. The motives that actuate them are in some cases different. A certain set desire to see the downfall of the Universal Negro Improvement Association because of petty spite and jealousy and because they themselves desire to build up an organization of their own, Another set fights the movement because they are paid to do so by those who do not intend to assist the Negro to liberate himself and be a real man. Another its opposition against the organization because of their disappoint ment in not being able on previous occasions to rob and exploit the movement in their own interest. Still another group fights the organization because they do not desire to see any other leadership succeed among Negroes other than their own, but the most dengerous group of all is that group that has robbed the Black Star Line and desire to cover up their tobbery, in that within recent months a thorough investigation has been started to find out what has been done in the matter of over \$25,000 which is said to be deposited with the United States Shipping Board for the purchase of a ship, and the continuous deception of the aid parties in promising the president of the Black Star Line, the Board of Directors and stockholders that a ship by the name of the S. S. Orion, which should have been named the S. S. Phyllis Wheatley, should have been delivered since April of 1921 and is not yet delivered up to the time of writing, and for 11 hours a thou and and one excuses have been given.

# A Bit of History

Neveryhole will remember. I left the United States of America on the 28th of Lebruary, 1921, for a busine of trip to the West Indies and Central America, the real purpose was to carry out an arrangement that had been made whereby the Black Star Line Steamship Corporation, the auxiliary of the Universal Negro Improvement Association, would have acquired a ship and have her sail from New York in April or May of said year for Africa, carrying passengers, immigrants and materials. The directors of the Black Star Line arranged that a certain part of the money for the purchase of the ship should have been raised in America and the other portion in Central America and the West Indies. Plans were, therefore, laid for the raising of certain sums of money in America by certain representatives of the corporation, and that I, as President of the corporation, would raise a substantial part of it in Central America and the West Indies. Whilst I left, feeling assured that those left behind would have maintained a good intention towards the plans laid, it has been discovered that immediately after I left the country certain parties who assumed the active management of affairs of the

Black Star Line in the United States planned, in conjunction with others, that I should never return to America, and that during my absence from the country, plunderings of all kinds would have been indulged in, and if, a collapse cause I would have been blamed for a away in the West Indies, without even having an opportunity of finding out what was wrong, nor have a voice to express my point of view. Immediately during my absence from the country changes were made in the plans that were laid out for the acquirement of the African boat; new arrangements were made, contracts were signed and for four months, whilst all these changes had been going on not even a word of information was sent to me, to acquaint me of what was being done.

# A Treacherous Plot

befort was made the more to seal my doom in preventing me from returning to the United States of America. A great state of demoralization went on, not only in the Black Star Line, but in the Universal Negro Improvement Association, during my absence, and when, by good fortune, I was able to return around the 15th of July, 1921, just fifteen days prior to our international convention, I was confronted with a state of disorganization which was most alarming. My reappearance in the United States of America was a great surprise to many and some of those who were said to be my associates, and especially in the work of the Black Star Line. The S. S. "Phyllis Wheatley" that should have been secured since April, and which I had every reason to believe was either at anchor in New York, or had sailed for Africa, was newhere to be found! The money that I sent from the West Indies and Central America, as well as other funds raised in my name, and in the name of the Black Star Line in my abtence, were supposed to be deposited with the United States Shipping Board by certain parties. and that it was expected that the boat would be awarded at any time, even though the directors of the Black Star Line, placing their reliance on one who represented the corporation in my absence, had promised them every day that the boat would be awarded tomorrow, which tomorrow extended over a period of three mouths, information of which was supplied me two days after my arrival in New York.

Because of the argency of the convention, I had to concentrate most of my time on regulating the program for our big event, and had to sit in convention for three days for the carrying through of our big program, during which time, however, I made every effort to find out just what had been done in my absence in the matter of the Black Star Line. It like the rest of the directors, was told that the boat would be in New York tomorrow. Formatrow came and went, and still it was temorrow. Finally notice was erved that either the boat or the money must be delivered immediately, and then communication, were brought to show where the last or the way, and everything would be well in another couple of days.

# The Part of the Negro Press

Faccace dragged on and on, until I took definite steps to locate either the money or the ship, and then to my surprise where \$25,000 should have been only \$12,500 was credited, and after the individuals found out to what extent my investigation had gone, then a most vile and wicked propaganda, started in several Negro newspapers and magazines, lambasting me for things I knew nothing about, for the purpose of covering up the responsible parties, and then anonymous communications started to reach the government from all directions, and complaints were also made, for the purpose of causing my immediate arrest, the collapse of the Universal Negro Improvement Association, and then the covering up of all that had happened in the matter of the Black Star Line during my absence from the United States of America.

# "Honesty Is the Best Policy"

Selfish, wicked groups of Negroes, at different points, have contributed to this vile and wicked plan, some without even knowing consciously what they were doing, and thus this reveals the attempt made by dishonest and dishonorable people of our own race to interfere with the success of a movement that aims at the liberation of four hundred million Nebroes. Every effort between heaven and earth has been made within the last two months to discredit me and put me out of the way so as to cover up the dirt of others. After certain individuals found out that their misdeeds were coming to light they have been using every means possible to

cause the authorities to suppress the Universal Negro Improvement Association, which would act as a cloak to their many sins a line the race, and especially against the Black Star Line. But these poor corrupt individuals seem to think that dishonesty of any kind can be covered permanently. One dishonest act will lead you from one crime to the other until you are completely found out and placed before the bar of justice.

### Playing to the Criminal-Minded

The cause of the Universal Negro Improvement Association cannot be interrupted in any way, it is too great and mighty a cause, so that any effort to damage its power will be futile.

We who lead this mighty movement know that such things as related above are to be expected, and when they do happen they will not discourage us in the least, but will only place us in a better position to know even our own, and to deal with them as they do deserve.

Several Negro newspaper editors have most wickedly encouraged propaganda against the Black Star Line, to the lost of the good will of the race, and to the satisfaction of the criminal-minded, who have planned just such a result. The plots to defeat the Black Star Line are many, and the plotters seem to think that they have succeeded in a way in embarrasting the corporation; at least one of the plotters, in Philadelphia, a Negro lawyer, has been making the rounds of that city, trying to collect the stock certificates of stock holders, that he tried to make disgruntled and dissatisfied for the purpose of bringing a bankruptcy suit against the Black Star Line, so as to carry out the intention of the organized enemies of which he is one, so that they may rejoice in the success of their scheme.

### Only Secondary to the Larger Plan

. But the idiots do not seem to realize that the Black Star Line is but a small matter compared with the bigger object of the Universal Negro Improvement Association; that the Black Star Line bears the same relation to the Universal Negro Improvement Association that the Shipping Board bears to the United States Government, and that even though \$300,080,000 may be lost in the Shipping Board the government will still conduct the affairs of that corporation for the benefit of the nation. And so, even through the tricks and dishenesty of a Liew employes of the Black Stard ine the contribution cannot be performently work of the Universal Negro Improvement Association shall go on, and nothing like a million dollars, or even ten millions, can permanently interfere with its mighty program. All the loyal stockholders of the Back Star Line have nothing to fear, because the Universal Negro Improvement Association will, if the encmics try to do anything to the corporation, make every effort to secure the interest of every loyal stockholder, who believes in the cause of Africa for the Africans and an emancipated Negro race. The effort of this Philadelphia lawyer has opened the eyes of the Universal Negro Improvement Association to the danger of having the stock of the Black Star Line in the hands of people who may use it in the interest of the enemy. So, if the Negro lawyer wants to do what he and his associates have plotted to do, they may be only helping the Universal Negro Improvement Association to comine the affairs of the Black Star Line in the future to the association alone and to those faithful stockhloders who we shall always protect and who shall be benefited by the future success of this Negro steamship line.

# A Mighty World Force

Some people are to little minded that they cannot see beyond the immediate present, but all true Negroes of vision can foresee nothing else but success for the Universal Negro Improvement Association and its auxiliary corporations. Let me say to the Negro peoples of the world that this is the hour when we shall stick together the more to put over the mighty program, which seems to be causing universal construction. The Universal Negro Improvement Association stands at its strongest point. It is a recognized world force. We have spent millions of dollars to reach the position we now occupy, and it is only a question of a few more years when untold benefits will be derived from the successful operation of this great movement. We have done the pinocer work, we have cleared the war for that brighter day that is to come, and, now that we have reached this point, with our beautiful plans, I hope that no real Negro in the world will real that for one minute that anything of failure or disappointment can come along the permanently wreck the good work of this organization.

# Let 'em Fight!

Let our enemies fight; let the traiters within our own ranks fight as they may; let them do whatsoever they desire to do, there is one thing we are assured of: that the Universal Negro Improvement Association shall stand the test of time!

# A Word of Cheer

We are succeeding more and more every day. From every corner of the world comes a loyalty that bears no question. Everybody knows the plots that have been laid for the embarrassment of this our movement, but everybody is the more prepared to carry the cause to victory. So my message to you this week is "Be of good cheer. Nothing can happen to the Black Star Line that will permanently affect the object we have in view. We may be disappointed today in not getting dividends and immediate profits, but remember, men and women, we have an object in view; that we have built up a mighty movement that is now world wide, and that it is only a matter of sticking together, keeping our colors flying, and then everything will come to us in good time."

Let those who want to do evil do as they may. I am appealing to those who are loyal and true to the cause to stick solidly by, and surely victory will perch upon our banners.







# FOUR HUNDRED MILLION NEGROES TO GET THE U. N. I. A. AND PUSH IT OVER

FELLOW MEN OF THE NEGRO RACE, Greeting:

The hour has come for universal action on the part of each and everyone of us in propogating the cause of the Universal Negro Improvement Association. Just at this time a great effort is being made to undermine the nationalistic hope as well as the industrial, commercial, and social aspirations of our race, and if we do not line up our forces the more, it is most reasonable to assume that these forces of evil will make a terrible inroad into our plans of liberty.

I have an abiding faith and confidence in the four hundred millions of people, who, having passed through the hardships and difficulties of the past, are determined that nothing in the world shall deter them in their hope for, and their determination of, winning a better place in the affairs of men. We are in no way alarmed or disappointed over what the enemies have done in trying to create embarrassment for our movemnt just at this time. As the founder of the Universal Negro Improvement Association, I fully calculated that the time would come when the evil designs of our enemies would work themselves out to our embarrassment, but it has always been my faith that we could rise above every handicap, every barrier, every embarrassment which would be placed in the way. Now, we are called to the colors of the Red, the Black and the Green; it is a test of the manhood that we are made of, whether we are worthy to carry this great cause to victory, or whether we are to go down to defeat before the united forces

The Universal Negro Improvement Association has determined that come weal, come woe, the cause of the Negro shall be carried to the fullest extreme. There is no disappointment, I say there is no discouragement, there is but hope.

The trouble inflicted upon the Black Star Line, as an auxiliary of the Universal Negro Improvement Association, is but a natural consequence of the experience that must be encountered in perfecting the great plans by which we shall ultimately win the day for our complete freedom,

# Exaggerating Things

A great deal of noise is being made over the infinitesimal matter that has caused the embarrassment of the Black Star Line, but we must rise above such things, we must rise above disappointment of all kinds, if we are to achieve the

I hardly believe there is one Negro in the world who has more invested in the Black Star Line than I have; I hardly believe there is one Negro in the world who has more invested in the Universal Negro Improvement Association than I have; all my earnings are invested in this great movement, but at no time do I feel in any way afraid of the consequence, because I have enough faith and confidence in myself and in my race to believe that ultimately we will triumph, ultimately we will be victorious, at which time all of us will enjoy the fruits of our

When it is considered that our organization is just about four and a half years old in the United States of America, and that the Black Star Line is just about three years old, you will readily admit that we have not yet given our move ment a real chance to prove itself, and these little embarrassments, these little difficulties placed in our way by paid men of our own race and the enemies, will only act as stepping stones to the accomplishing of greater things. They talk about embarrassing the Black Star Line. We shall yet see a Black Star Line with her hundreds of ships, sailing the seven seas; so long as man is man and God is God, so long as man is given the domination of this world, 400,000,000 of us Negro men, black men, shall bring into existence a line of steamships that shall belt the world. It is good that our experience has not been a very costly one, but just one that has probably caused us to have lost through the dishonesty and machinations of evil ones a few hundred thousand dollars, but what of a few hundred thousand dollars to the accomplishment of the great ork that must be done? It costs the United States Gove: ent hundreds of millions of dellars annually to keep itself intact; it costs the 60,000,000 people of England hundreds of millions of dollars annually to keep the country in proper orde; it costs the French people billion, of francs annually to hop their country protected; even little Japan . . is hundreds of millions of dollars annually for the safety of the 60,000,000 Japanese, then what must we say when we have spent just a couple hundred the bringing into existence of an ideal that is dear to our hearts, the ideal of universal liberay among 400,000,000 Negroes? Have we lost anything? I answer, absolutely nothing in comparison to what it means to others to win their liberty, to win freedom, to be industrially, commercially, politically independent.

# On the Look-Out

No Negro who is a man has lost one bit of hope; but, on the contrary, he has redoubled his energy, his confidence, the more that the program of the Universal Negro Improvement Association may be put over, and, men, we are going to put it over with a vengeance. We are going to prove to the world that the Negro has reached the point where he cannot be turned or pushed back, but he shall demand the right to go forward. We are going forward in spite of the opposition of the legions of hell. We are going forward in spite of the embarrassments and difficulties placed in the way; we are going forward because we have accepted the High Omnipotent as our guide, and Jesus our Savior as our Standard-bearer, and wheresoever they lead four hundred million of us shall follow. The object is the freedom of Africa; this object of ours is causing consternation throughout the world; European nations are trembling; they are fearful of the outcome of this determination of the Negro peoples of the world under the leadership of the Universal Negro Improvement Association. Have you not read the signs of the times? Have you not heard the news? This is the latest bit of news from South Africa:

"JOHANNESBURG, South Africa, February 17 .- Two hundred striking natives went on the warpath at Fordsburg today attacking the European colony. They were dispersed by police and forty arrested."

The work that has been done by us is worth billions and billions of dollars. But with what have we done it? With the paltry dollars and cents that you have given us and placed at our command, and even though some of the villains of our own race have robbed and exploited us of the little you have contributed, yet with the little at our disposal we have been able to belt the whole world and unite the scattered race with the sentiment of "Africa for the Africans." those at home and those abroad." We can satisfy ourselves that in another short while we shall see the realization of our hopes. Africa is awakened, but we must keep up the agitation, we must perfect the organization, so that all of us can be of one mind, and that in the future, when one African strikes four hundred milloins of us will strike at the same time for the freedom of our

Negro, because all men of thought and learning know that the world in which we live is undergoing changes, and that the race and nation that does not keep up with the changes of the time, will be cast off and perish in the oblivion of nothingness in the near future, hence it is up to us all, whether we be Irish, Hindus, Egyptians, Jews or Negroes, to fight for a place in the political sun of the world. The Jew fights for the restoration of Palestine; the Irish fights for the liberation of Ireland; the Indian fights for the emancipation of his country, the Egyptian is determined that Egypt shall be free, and similarly four hundred million Negroes of the world are determind that Africa shall be free from the domination of alien powers: but it is natural also to expect that these alien powers will do everything in their power to prevent the Negro peoples of the world, freeing Africa from their domination, and when we have these little embarrassments, as in the case of the Black Star Line, which we can trace back to the machinations of the enemy, we will naturally not be disappointed and disheartened, because you must remember "everything is fair in love and war." The embarrassment in our movement; but we have another consolation that every race and nation has had its traitors, even this great country wherein we live today, when she was struggling for freedom, nurtured a traiter, because she had Benedict Arnold. We therefore might apprise ourselves of the fact that we may expect traitors who will make efforts to destroy us on behalf of the enemy; yes, even as Judas sought to destroy his Christ, so as to down the great Christian religion, so we will have traitors who will try to betray us for the downfall of our great cause, but we will remember that every cause that is righteous is bound to live. Let our foundation be based upon righteousness, and nothing in the world can interfere with our success. Remember men, that this is not the hour for discouragement, this the hour for renewed energy and determination, and renewed confidence. As for me, I have cut out one course in life, and that is, I shall go forward, upward and onward, until I see the realization of a free and redeemed motherland. It is little that each and every one of us can do, to work and if needs be, die for this cause; the cause of liberty is sweet, it is dear, and if it must be purchased, some of us are prepared to purchase it with the last drep of our blood.

The Universal Negro Improvement Association is preparing a program that vill place us in a position in another few years, far in advance of the times, and which shall lift us out of the embarrassing environments in which we live. All that you have to do is to stick solidly by this movement, and under all circumstances and conditions work with it, and if needs be, die for it.

### The Determination of a Race Let us prepare now for our great international convention of August. Let

us ring the changes throughout the world. Let us work so now that in August we will show to the world how determined Negroes are; yes, we want at this time every Negro community in the world to be represented at our third international convention. We want every Negro in the world to know of this bigger program, because at that convention we are going to bring changes which will re-echo
