'TURN OUT THE TRAITORS' IS HON. MARCUS GARVEY'S APPEAL TO DELEGATES IN CONVENTION IN RINGING MESSAGE

We give below a verbatim report of the Hon. Marcus Garvey's message to the delegates assembled at Detroit in Convention. This message was read by Mr. Van Lowe at the opening session of the Convention on Sunday afternoon, March 14:

Fellow-Members, Ladies and Gentlemen:—

It is good and becoming that you have called yourselves together to discuss and regulate the vital affairs of your great organization. It would have been the pleasure of my life to be present in your midst today, but circumstances that you and I have no control over tend to keep us apart. This was to be expected, hence our sorrow is modified, knowing that to those who serve the cause of humanity go the thorns of life. We must expect to suffer, and, some of us, to pass through the vale of tears, but with the sublime knowledge that our Heavenly Father has decreed the redemption of our race and our final triumph over our enemies.

Coming Together for Serious Reason

Your coming together is for a serious reason. Since my incarceration, undue advantage has been taken of your organization and your interests. Those who planned and caused my imprisonment did not hesitate to work upon the leading representatives left behind to carry out their purpose of the complete demolition of the organization. The very fact that this convention has been suddenly called and not in the usual manner and in the customary place is proof that something is terribly wrong in our affairs.

Because the organization has been under the control of others during my imprisonment, I was unable, even though I made several attempts early in 1925 and again in 1926, and through the Second Volume of my book, to inform you so as to have you rise as one man to protect your interests before it became too late. My efforts were skillfully suppressed and the wreck of evil intent gradually went on until we were ultimately successful in calling you together to stop the traitors in their work of selfishness and destruction.

There are many ways of hurting a great cause, such as ours, with the appearance of serving it. We have been injured with impunity. Because of the peculiar nature of our effort, it is very easy for a traitor within to sell himself and yet pretending to be serving us as a friend.

Influence of Evil Forces

Judas served Christ up to the final hour. Did he not ask "Is it I?"

For years I have kept our organization from falling under the evil forces and influences operating against us, and, because of that, the forces were not disposed to treat with me through my stand against them, but they have sought every opportunity to trip and influence and use those associated with me, to defeat the cause. They have succeeded in roping in the unfaithful leaders I left behind, to the extent that some of them openly flouted my

authority and rebelled against my timely warnings and advice, hence the ruin that they have brought for the satisfaction of our enemies.

If my instructions had been followed, and if my counsel had been taken, I feel sure that there would have been no need for this emergency convention. But I am glad that all is not lost, for by your timely action we can save ourselves from the corrupt gang and our enemies and push forward a stronger organization that shall lead the way to African redemption and the race emancipated.

Do not be afraid. You are now on the threshold of international success. While the unfaithful within have been working for the enemy, I have held the line, through my wife and other agencies, and all you have to do is to bring up your forces of organization for the final international battle of Africa redeemed. The League of Nations and the Locarno Council might not have listened to the voice in the wilderness, but as sure as there is a God, the sun of Africa is rising and before many years, shall shed its light upon a united people, free and happy in a country of their own. Through the loyal service of my wife I have gained many friends in the white race to our cause. They are also working hard to help us, but we must get rid of our traitors and liars, for with them we can accomplish nothing. We have won the thoughtful sentiment of the world. We must now organize this sentiment for the final triumph of our cause. Remember you are strong through the unity of forces and right now you must come together as never before to oust and defeat the enemy in our midst.

Influence of Studied Speech

Let no fine, studied speech move you at this time. Be moved only by that which is from the heart. Let real actions speak and not words. Words are cheap.

The liars have deceived the people in New York as to what they have done to save the organization. Investigation will show that they made hay while the sun was shining. They have sold and mortgaged everything they

found that I left in the hands of the people. It took no ability to do that. A child can destroy your property but it takes ability, intelligence and courage to accumulate. That is why I hate the rogues for their lies and deception. Years of accumulation of property and other interests have been frittered away to please the enemy. How can the rogues who helped them by negligence, duplicity and otherwise, have nerve enough to appeal to you for further support to injure yourselves?

This convention is for electing real men to protect your interests. They must act as men. They allow no sympathy for evil-doers, otherwise they neglect your interests. I ask that you support this convention in every way. The men who called the convention did it with my full sanction and approval. The New York gang and their cohorts have been raising the cry that the convention is not called constitutionally. When you are dealing with rascals you act urgently, irrespective of technicalities in the constitution. If a murderer is about to kill you would you resort to the technicality of non-defense "thou shalt not kill?" Your first duty should be to protect yourself and that is just what you are doing at this convention. I have prepared a report for the convention which will be read by Mr. Van Lowe at the business session tomorrow. In it I have laid out the facts and charges; you will deal with the report, with all statements and documents attached, after it is read.


Returning Thanks to Friends

She has lined up powerful friends to our cause and with righteousness we are bound to win. Our friends in Virginia are getting the Assembly there to help us. I have requested the Committee of Presidents to have our petition sent to Congress that has been neglected by the unfaithful in New York, as also to have you in your various States petition your Legislatures, as Virginia is doing, to create for us a nation in Africa. Go to it and never say die until Africa is won for the Negro race.

Let the convention be a ringing success and after you have turned out the Judases, I shall feel happy that our labor was not in vain.

Hold fast to the colors, pray for God's guidance and strength in the fight for liberty and surely we shall win. Abundance of good wishes. I have the honor to be

HONORABLE MARCUS GARVEY IN BURNING MESSAGE TO CONVENTION REVEALS DUPLICITY OF PRESENT ADMINISTRATION

SUBMITS DOCUMENTARY EVIDENCE PROVING CHARGE THAT SHERRILL DELIBERATELY DECEIVED HIM

GREAT LEADER SAYS SHERRILL NEGLECTED WORK TO RUN ABOUT COUNTRY RAISING MONEY TO PAY HIMSELF AND ASSOCIATES "BACK SALARY"

Says Mortgaging of Liberty Hall, New York, Is Illegal and Urges Immediate Prosecution and Removal of George A. Weston as the First Step in an Effort to Save the Property Which Is Now in the Hands of Speculators

Atlanta, Georgia, March 15, 1926. To the Convention of the Universal Negro Improvement Association, Assembled at Detroit, Michigan.

Colleagues, Ladies and Gentlemen—I am indeed glad that you have assembled yourselves in Special Convention for the purpose of taking hold of the affairs of your organization and its auxiliary the Black Cross Navigation and Trading Company, which have been so wretchedly abused through the duplicity and intrigue of unworthy representatives.

DARED TO SERVE I am in prison. I am here because I dared to serve you, neglect my home, a loyal and dear woman, my wife, and myself. Above all the things I prize most in the world is the honor of my name. I have never, in all my life, to my conscious knowledge, done a mean act, because it has always been the policy of my life to "live with honor" or "die for the principle."

Import of Organization It is impossible for you to accuse the honorable import of the Universal Negro Improvement Association and its effect on world politics. I am fully aware that all of you have not been trained to the art of international diplomacy and world commercial and industrial intrigue. It takes the careful student, or man of experience, to fathom all that is taking place around us in the fields of politics, sociology, industry and commerce.

Making the Sacrifice If you have a job you will forget yourself as I have done, and picture to yourselves the agonies of our forefathers, their cries and our country. I ignored the call of a selfish posterity from a return of such horrible conditions. It is because I love my race, my people, and my children that I made the sacrifice. Must it all be in vain? Yes, it will be in vain unless you, right now, make me able to present to you, month, take positive and decisive steps to take the Association completely out of the hands of William Sherrill, G. O. Marks, George Weston and others associated with them, to run the great cause. If you believe in me then believe that Sherrill, Weston and Marks are untrue. I do not charge all these things that you have heard me say, but I charge them with you. I want you to know that Sherrill and the rest of them never intended that I should be able to present to you, month, take positive and decisive steps to take the Association completely out of the hands of William Sherrill, G. O. Marks, George Weston and others associated with them, to run the great cause.

The convention has just taken temporary adjournment after a five-hour session. The entire morning was devoted to the registration of delegates who have continued to pour in throughout the day. At the afternoon session the special convention message from the Honorable Marcus Garvey was read. The delegates listened with rapt attention. At the conclusion of the reading of this message by J. Milton Van Lowe an adjournment was taken. The message of the President-General will be discussed tomorrow.

William L. Sherrill, Acting President-General, arrived this morning. Sir Levi Lord, Auditor General, is scheduled to arrive on Tuesday. Among those present at the opening of the convention were Sir Percival Burrows, Assistant Secretary-General; Mrs. Amy Jacques-Garvey, wife of the President-General; Madame M. L. T. De Mena and Dr. Jay J. Peters, members of the Marcus Garvey Committee on Justice; Messrs. Tootie, Ware, Haynes and Craigen, members of the Presidents' Committee; and Mr. Norton G. G. Thomas, acting managing editor of The Negro World.

On Sunday evening, March 14, a great public mass meeting was held at Turner's Hall. Dr. Peters, Madame De Mena and the members of the Committee of Presidents spoke. Another public mass meeting will be held tonight.

The businesslike attitude of the delegates, their extreme silence and rapt attention during the reading of the documents submitted for their consideration by the President General, clearly shows that they realize the seriousness of the task before them.

SPECIFIC CHARGES OF MAL-ADMINISTRATION AND DISLOYALTY BROUGHT AGAINST WILLIAM L. SHERRILL BY THE HONORABLE MARCUS GARVEY

- 1. Duplicity and intrigue against the association, the Black Cross and Marcus Garvey, President-General U. N. I. A.
2. Disloyalty to organization and Marcus Garvey, President-General.
3. Using his office and circumstances of the imprisonment of the President-General to satisfy his own selfish purpose by payment of back salaries, etc., while neglecting the urgent needs of the association and the Black Cross.
4. Insincerity and treachery.
5. Failing to immediately take charge of the affairs of the Black Cross upon the imprisonment of Marcus Garvey and directing same in the interests of the organization.
6. Failing to carry out instructions given by President-General for the good of the organization and the Black Cross.
7. Conspiring to pass the affairs of the Black Cross over into the hands of Crawford and Cyril Briggs, enemies of the movement.
8. Undermining the work of Mrs. Garvey for my release as well as that of the Marcus Garvey Committee on Justice.

Much of the first-hand information obtained by the Honorable Marcus Garvey concerning the conditions existing at Headquarters in New York City, was given in letters which he received from time to time. Very often this was his only source of information regarding business transactions being carried on by the officials of the organization. As the secret opinions of the writers, the contents of these letters are very illuminating and will throw much light upon the present situation. The writers of these letters will be as interested as the public to learn the real opinions of their associates and, in some instances, their fellow-conspirators. The letters are reproduced in order of time without special consideration for their subject matter.

The following letter, written by G. E. Carter, Secretary-General of the organization, upon his taking charge in the absence of Bourne and Sherrill on a tour in Honduras, contains a little information about everything in general and the ship in particular. It was the return of the vessel that the organization is still waiting for the large sum of money Mr. Carter promised to send back from that Western tour:

June 24, 1925. Hon. Marcus Garvey, Imp. Assn., Universal Negro Imp. Assn., My Dear Mr. Garvey: Your kind favor received. Accept my thanks for the confidence reposed until full explanation is had, and the appreciation expressed by you for the return of the vessel that the organization is still waiting for the large sum of money Mr. Carter promised to send back from that Western tour:
1. Making contracts without notifying me. Making contracts that tended to injure the Black Cross.
2. Wasting the funds of the Black Cross to satisfy the plans of our enemies.
3. Allowing unnecessary debts to be levied against the ship General Goethals to satisfy the plans of our enemies.
4. Wasting the funds of the U. N. I. A. to satisfy the plans of our enemies.
5. Wickedly absenting himself from the office at headquarters at time of critical need.
6. Touring the country and going abroad only in his own selfish interest to draw salary and allowances when his services were needed at headquarters.
7. Refusing to sacrifice for the association and the Black Cross a critical time and applying money which could have been used to help the organization to pay his back and other salaries, to the immediate injury of the organization.
8. Setting a bad example to fellow executives by his negligence.
9. Making false speeches to deceive the people regarding the Black Cross and the ship, General Goethals, at Liberty Hall and elsewhere.
10. Neglecting to carry out the African program undertaken by the organization and on which large sums of money had been spent.
11. Conspiring with the enemies of the organization.
12. Refusing to have the books of the Black Cross and the U. N. I. A. audited, at the proper time, as directed by me from time to time, and as requested by the minutes of the corporation.
13. Sending me an unsigned statement of the funds of the U. N. I. A. when he was forced to make statement.

24. Sending me, after being forced to, an incomplete and unsigned statement of the funds of the Black Cross after a wait of nine months after request. Refusing to send me a statement showing the bulk of monies received for the Black Cross from divisions and individuals during the months of October, November and December, 1925, which amounted to more than \$20,000.

25. Shiftily seeking to block the spreading of the aims and objects of the association through the publication of the second volume of my book.
26. Encouraging the publication of false and mischievous statements to prejudice the public mind against me.

27. Being used by our enemies to dismantle the organization, etc. During my thirteen months' imprisonment, Sherrill has sent me no funds to meet the costly expenses undergone to the extent of hundreds of dollars for the association and Black Cross Navigation Company. Such expense has been met by monies sent for my personal use by my wife and friends. These and all other charges appearing in this statement I charge against William Sherrill. Being confined in prison I rely on the letters hereinafter referred to and attached, and individuals attending the convention, as witnesses to prove.

Dear Mr. Garvey: I know that you are far from being pleased with me, because you must feel that I have not treated you in the manner that you desired which sets my mind through the medium of a letter. I prefer to call and see you personally in the clear light of day. I am in a hurry, in order that I can present you with a truthful state of affairs and I am sure that you will understand my position in the Association, and that I have not been pestering you with telegrams and letters and all the (Continued on page 7)

The following letters were written to the Honorable Marcus Garvey by William L. Sherrill in the weeks just following Mr. Garvey's incarceration in Atlanta prison. It will be noted that Mr. Sherrill goes to great lengths to try to convince Mr. Garvey of his continued loyalty and support. However, in spite of his protestations of love, admiration and loyalty for his great chief, Mr. Sherrill had not visited Mr. Garvey up to the time of the writing of the last letter. He does manage to hint at such a desire in the last letter. The letters follow without comment. Readers will be able to form their own conclusions as to their sincerity in the light of subsequent events.

February 14, 1925. Honorable Marcus Garvey, Atlanta, Ga. My Dear Mr. Garvey: While I feel that my contract with you for the past three years is sufficient for you to judge whether or not I would be loyal, both to you as a friend, and to the cause of the Negro, I also feel that at such a time as this, when you are removed from active participation in the affairs of a great organization built up by your genius and untiring effort, double assurance of my loyalty to both you and the association, is not time and paper wasted.

My faith and confidence in you remain unshaken. My admiration for the quality of leadership found in you is greater than ever. You, like all great leaders, have demonstrated fully your willingness to pay the full price of leadership. 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Atlanta, Georgia, March 13, 1926. To Whom It May Concern: This is to certify that my wife, Mrs. Amy Jacques Garvey has, during the period of my incarceration, remained loyal and devoted to me in all her duties and obligations as a true and loving wife. She has ceaselessly worked, with tremendous opposition, to protect and defend me during this my time of trial and suffering in the interest of a cause I am not neglected her to serve. She also has sacrificed and suffered for the cause, and my great sorrow is that I am, by nature of my present situation, rendered unable to give her the protection necessary and to show my appreciation of her unselfish service to me and to the cause I love.

She, along with the Marcus Garvey Committee on Justice, has sponsored my public defense and all that has been done for my relief has been through them, with the aid of friends and well-wishers. The wicked and vicious abuse of my wife by my enemies and certain Negro newspapers is but another scheme of my rivals and jealous enemies in the cause of African redemption, to cast aspersion and heap ignominy on my name. Because of the service I have rendered my race I call upon all of my friends to chivalrously protect the true name of my wife from the vile and wicked tricks of my enemies. 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LET'S PUT IT OVER

THE CONSPIRATORS COMMIT SUICIDE

The letters, telegrams and documents referred to by the Hon. Marcus Garvey in his revealing message to the delegates assembled in convention at Detroit and published in this issue of The Negro World must sound the death-knell to any lingering hopes, cherished by Messrs. Sherrill, Mark, and others, continuing to pester the Negro peoples of the world with their inept leadership.

Men have suffered long-term imprisonment for offenses less grave than these; reputations have been forever blasted for lesser deceptions and double-dealing, fraud and intrigue, lying and hypocrisy, than have now been exposed to the public gaze.

If there is a human being living who doubts the necessity and the urgency for a change in the administration of the gang now in the saddle, let him or her spend a brief hour with The Negro World and read the distressing revelations which the Founder and President-General of the Universal Negro Improvement Association has been compelled to make.

Let them see for themselves how men convict themselves and each other by the written word; how they brand themselves as miserable offenders against countless canons of good taste, decency and honesty.

It only remains for the conspirators to retire to a corner, put on sackcloth, and cogitate thus: "You can fool some of the people all the time; you can fool all of the people some of the time; but you can't fool all of the people all of the time."

WHAT SHALL THEY SAY OF US IN AFRICA?

The steady and critical gaze of the world is focused upon the great convention now being held in Detroit, Michigan, by the Universal Negro Improvement Association. This convention has been called so that summary action might be taken to safeguard the interests of the Negro peoples of the world as represented by the international membership of the association.

The primary purpose of this convention is to remove from office William L. Sherrill and George O. Marke, and to appoint in their places men more able than they, more sincere than they, men to whom the leadership of the greatest organization in the world among Negroes may be more safely entrusted. It is the considered opinion of the founder and President-General of the Universal Negro Improvement Association and of the vast majority of Negroes in America who comprise the membership of the association that only by the removal of these men can the organization be preserved to carry on the splendid work which it has begun.

The Honorable Marcus Garvey now languishes in a Federal prison because he fearlessly advocated the only course compatible with the race's honor and well-being, a course which his weak-kneed associates fear to chart. The leadership of the Universal Improvement Association is a test of manhood. The successful leader of this great organization must have backbone; he must be endowed with courage and tenacity, and he must be willing to sacrifice. The successful leader of the Universal Negro Improvement Association must exhibit a sincere and honest desire to carry on under the direction and advice of its creator and guide, the Honorable Marcus Garvey.

Sherrill and Marke have failed miserably and in every way to measure up to even the simplest and most unexcusing demands of leadership. Their removal is necessary to the continued life of the organization and members of the organization who have the power to remove them must not allow themselves to be blinded by maudlin sentiment and at any time lose sight of the great purpose for which this convention was called and the far-reaching influence of its decisions.

The question before the membership of the Universal Negro Improvement Association is not whether the dignity of a handful of men, who have proven themselves vacillating, inefficient and unworthy of trust, shall be preserved, but whether this great international organization shall remain intact to carry on its work among the 400,000,000 Negroes of the world.

of these miserable, incompetent sinners has been nothing but ship, ship, ship. Saving the ship has engrossed all of their time and taken full toll of their attention and ability, to the detriment and neglect of all else. A whole year has been wasted, thousands of dollars thrown away, and yet the plight of the ship is as bad today as it was a year ago. The management of the business of the S. S. General G. W. Goethals, during the past year, is a monument to the incompetency of those who have directed the affairs of the association since Marcus Garvey's incarceration. No further proof of the necessity for their removal is needed. Even if their intentions were good, the management of the affairs of the association demands certain business acumen and ability which they have clearly shown they do not possess.

A clear case of inefficiency and disloyalty to Marcus Garvey has been made out against William L. Sherrill. George O. Marke has long been known to be an enemy to the Honorable Marcus Garvey and to the organization, but not until he became the mentor and confidential advisor of William L. Sherrill was he able to do the organizational and advisory work which he is doing. He eagerly seized upon the opportunity to weaken the organization and discredit its great leader through weak-minded, but ambitious, William Sherrill.

Ninety-nine per cent. of the membership of the Universal Negro Improvement Association is lined up behind Marcus Garvey. If half of the time which has been thrown away had been spent in an honest endeavor to carry on the business of the association with the confidence, counsel and aid of Mr. Garvey, a different chapter would be in the writing today, and men and women throughout the world would not be in fear and trembling at the possible collapse of the greatest Negro movement in the world. Those in whose hands these decisions rest have a grave responsibility, a sacred duty to perform. The organization is now facing the greatest crisis in its history. The great leader is appealing to you from behind prison bars. He cannot be with you but he is sending his message. He asks that his followers again register their confidence in his leadership by divorcing themselves from the group which is about to accomplish the utter ruin of the organization. He asks that he be given a more competent, more loyal and more sincere group of men to work with. What will the answer be?

Last but not least, we must not forget that Africa, with her teeming millions is looking this way and awaiting with bated breath the action of this convention. We, who make up the membership of the Universal Negro Improvement Association, have promised to do our best for our less fortunate brothers and sisters across the sea. The Universal Negro Improvement Association is the embodiment of the hopes of those enslaved and oppressed millions. The price of a mistake now is too great; we must not err. The road is plain and straight. Let none wander therefrom.

EAST-INDIAN MAHARAJAS AND AFRICAN PARAMOUNT CHIEFS

In order to hold conquered peoples in subjection with the least possible friction, by reason of discontent among the "high and lofty," the British government has for years made a point of subsidizing the maharajahs, or native rulers, of the East Indies and the Paramount chiefs of the African tribes and, while allowing them a modicum of authority and privilege, has kept the supreme power of sanction or veto in the hands of the higher British authorities. In either case a salary and allowance out of all proportion to the intrinsic worth and services of the subsidized rulers, especially in the case of those of India, has been guaranteed. The Paramount chiefs of Africa have not fared so handsomely, but they have been kept in good humor, for the most part, by the subsidy and the strong arm of military power. In the case of the Indian Princes most of them have been educated in England, and some of them spend much of their time and money, most in a prodigal and profligate way of living, in England or on the Continent. Most of these baronets of the industry of their East Indian subjects who spend their time and money in this way, may not be satisfied with their lot and the hard economic and civil conditions under which their subjects have to live and pay exorbitant taxes, but they accept the situation without much complaint.

The British go on the theory that by buying the head of an East Indian or African people they can control the body of the people, and they come very near hitting the nail on the head, especially in the case of the East Indian Princes. Their people are fairly poor and are taxed to the utmost, but the leaders have their mouths shut by a lavish money provision and the people can do little to help themselves. It is the same, after a fashion, with the subsidized African chiefs.

Young Prince Sir Hari Singh has just succeeded to the throne of Cashmir, one of the smallest but one of the most important States of India because of its location. It has a population of only 4,000,000 people, but the inauguration of the new Maharajah has been attended with fetes that rival in splendor and lavishness those of the Arabian nights. This profligate Prince figured last year in the scandal with the Robertsons as "Mr. A.," when he was swindled out of a vast sum of money because of the intrigue and efforts to crush the scandal, if possible. And the British government did what it could to protect the money and the name of the princely profligate, who has now become the ruler of his people by and with the consent of the British Government. What can the people of India expect of such creatures as rulers?

Again, the Maharajah of Indore has just been forced to abdicate in favor of his son by the British government, because of his connection with several murders, in which his favorite woman and a Bombay merchant were concerned. And yet he was allowed to take himself off to England, with an iron chest full of priceless valuables and with a pension, and freedom to have "a high old time" spending his worthless time and fabulous wealth in Great Britain and on the Continent. All of which his impoverished subjects must pay for in sweat and tears, and the British government will see to it that they pay.

The African and East Indian people have many problems to overcome in the effort to be free and independent of their European lords, but the problem of dealing with their Maharajahs and Paramount chiefs who are on the payroll of the British or other European governments is one of the most difficult of them.

HEALTH TOPICS

Many of the homes I know have medicine cabinets. Perhaps they contain little medicine and many tubes of shaving cream or tooth paste, but they are full of bottles and boxes of "medicine chests," nevertheless.

Presented in their favor, I think you will agree that there are many dangers for soda water, tooth articles, juncos, jams, and jellies, washing caps, bottles, mouth wash, and other articles, which are sold in great quantities.

What should be in a home medicine chest? I would suggest a few simple things such as the following: Have a roll of adhesive and a few bandages, a package of sterile cotton wool, a bottle of sterile gauze neatly packed together where they can be quickly reached and taken out in case of accident.

The fountain springs and a hot water bag should be kept where they can be found readily. This is enough for the ordinary household. Keep the chest free from other articles not pertaining to illness. See that the shelves are neatly arranged so that things are not placed in front of the one which must be needed in a hurry.

RECOMMENDATIONS OF COMMITTEE OF PRESIDENTS SENT TO ATLANTA FEDERAL PRISON TO CONVEY THE SENTIMENTS OF THE CONFERENCE OF PRESIDENTS OF THE UNIVERSAL NEGRO IMPROVEMENT ASSOCIATION, HELD AT PARENT BODY HEADQUARTERS, NEW YORK, FROM OCTOBER 15 TO OCTOBER 22, 1925

Members of Committee: HON. FRED A. TOOTE, Philadelphia; HON. SIR WILLIAM WARE, Cincinnati; HON. SAMUEL A. HAYNES, Pittsburgh; HON. J. A. CRAIGEN, Detroit, with MR. G. G. THOMAS as Secretary.

To Hon. Marcus Garvey, President-General of the Universal Negro Improvement Ass'n. Sir:—The Presidents of the U. N. I. A. Divisions, assembled at New York City, New York, in conference at the request of the Executive Council of the U. N. I. A., beg to report to you, through us, their elected delegates, as follows:—

WE THE PRESIDENTS FEEL THAT THE PEOPLE HAVE LOST CONFIDENCE IN THE PRESENT ADMINISTRATION, AS HEADED BY THE ACTING PRESIDENT-GENERAL. THEIR JUDGMENT IS THAT A CHANGE SHOULD BE MADE IN SAID ADMINISTRATION AS EARLY AS POSSIBLE.

The Executive Council of the U. N. I. A. has, among other sins of omission, taken no definite action in regard to bringing about the release of the President-General, and there is nothing to cause the Presidents to feel assured that absolute indifference will not continue.

The Presidents feel that if the Association is to go forward there must be harmony between the administration and the President-General; harmony, which, it feels, is difficult of accomplishment at the present time or in the near future.

THE PRESIDENTS RECOMMEND THAT THE STATUS OF THE HON. G. O. MARKE, SUPREME DEPUTY, ENGAGE THE IMMEDIATE ATTENTION OF THE PRESIDENT-GENERAL WITH A VIEW TO A TERMINATION OF HIS EXISTENCE AS AN OFFICER OF THE ASSOCIATION. THE PRESIDENTS FEEL THAT MR. MARKE IS ANTAGONISTIC TO THE PRESIDENT-GENERAL AND NOT IN SYMPATHY WITH THE POLICY OF THE ADMINISTRATION.

The Presidents feel it is to a matter of vital importance that the President-General retain active control of The Negro World, the organ of the U. N. I. A., and that he take such steps as he deems necessary for attainment of this end.

The Presidents recommend that those divisions which are not incorporated be given permission to incorporate immediately with a view to the safeguarding of their interests.

The Presidents recommend that an independent audit of the books of the Black Cross Navigation and Trading Co. be immediately made.

The Presidents also recommend that a Secretary and Treasurer of the Black Cross Navigation Company be appointed.

The Presidents further feel that the salaries of the officers of the Black Cross Navigation Co. who are also officers of the U. N. I. A., be One Dollar per year—this to be retroactive in regard to all Directors and officers who have served the Company from the time of its inception.

THE PRESIDENTS RECOMMEND THAT THIS COMMITTEE, IN THE LIGHT OF THE PECULIAR POSITION NOW EXISTING IN NEW YORK, BE EMPOWERED TO PROCEED TO NEW YORK AND ACT, IN CO-OPERATION WITH THE OFFICERS OF THE NEW YORK LOCAL FOR THE BEST INTERESTS OF THE LOCAL, SINCE, AMONG OTHER THINGS, THE INTERESTS OF ALL OF THE DIVISIONS ARE INTIMATELY AND INEXTRICABLY BOUND UP WITH THOSE OF THE SAID LOCAL.

The Presidents recommend that the present Executive Secretary of the New York Local be removed, since his presence as an officer at this time will hinder speedy solution of the problem that confronts the Local and the Association.

Among the interesting revelations of the under-hand and secret passing out of information, either directly or indirectly, to the Honorable Marcus Garvey the attitude of Anthony Crawford is of some little importance. It must be borne in mind that the services of this man as agent for the Black Cross Navigation Company were acquired without the knowledge of the Executive Council.

Upon learning that Crawford was working for the company and inquiring about the second demand made one of the lawyers in question returned point blank and sent for me. In view of the fact that I had retained the company to him, and informed me that he did not intend to give up the second lawyer's legal work. The second lawyer also informed me that he had been approached by the same man and had given him \$25 as a loan. This he said in the hearing of my stenographer, knowing that the lawyer had treated him as a "hold-up" man.

This lawyer has made and is still making, desperate efforts to give me a chance to earn my brokerage on the vessel, thereby to have some control over the vessel. One of those connected with the company made a mild protest against the treatment of the vessel, but I am convinced that the protest is too mild to be genuine. I have requested my attorney to permit the publication of all Mr. Garvey's answers to Crawford's Appeal for Aid.

Anthony Crawford, 80 Wall Street, New York City, has had no official information from directors of the company, but he has been doing ever since my absence except information through my wife. They shall be held to strict accountability for their acts and if criminal prosecuted. I left them clear of all entanglements except ordinary business routine of operation that had been taken care of by proper management.
