Send to our headquarters whatsoever money you can afford, and get your friends and acquaintances to do likewise, so that, with the money at our disposal, we can finance the program which will bring about the accomplishment of our ideals. It is no use holding back. We have watched long enough to see the growth of the Universal Negro Improvement Association. We have seen it grow from thirteen members to four and a half millions in four years. We want you now to help these four and a half million members to unite the entire world of Negroes.

DON'T STAND CRITICIZING

Destructive criticism will not help. Watching and waiting will not help. But falling in line now to do your bit will help us to put over the program. We have waited for 300 years in this western world, and we have remained dormant in Africa for over 500 years, but the time has really come for all of us Africans at home, and Africans abroad, to throw in our energy, our wealth and and our resources and make this organization with the flag of the Red, the Black and the Green carry us on to Victory.

But if we keep our eyes on the goal and see nothing but success, all will be well.






