Let Us So Work That Memorial Day Will Be a Great Day in Mother Africa

Fellow-Men of the Negro Race, Greeting:

At this time when America is paying homage to its illustrious sons who made this republic great, let us seize an inspiration from the day and make it possible in the years to come for us to honor our glorious dead, men and women who have deserved well of their fellows, in the motherland, Africa.

The Universal Negro Improvement Association seeks to do for Africa similarly what the Pilgrims, and later, George Washington, did for America. We Negroes want a government of our own in Africa, so that we can be nationally, if not industrially and commercially, removed from competition in race, a condition that will make both races better friends, with malice toward none, but respect and appreciation for each.

Our greatest trouble, however, is with our own people. There are some of the race who are not in sympathy with an independent Negro nation. To them "they have lost nothing in Africa." They believe in the amalgamation of races for the production of new racial and national types; hence, their doctrine of social equality and the creating of a new American race. This feeling of theirs divides us into two separate and distinct schools of thought, and, apparently, we are now at war with each other, and they have gained the first victory in having me, through their misrepresentation, imprisoned for the purpose of rendering me hors de combat.

Believe in Race Purity

. But we who believe in race purity are going to fight the issue out for the salvation of both races, and this can only be satisfactorily done when we have established for the Negro a nation of his own. We believe that the white race should protect itself against racial commingling and the Negro should do the same. Nature intended that we should maintain our own identities. Our sins will not make the world better; hence, to us of the Universal Negro Improvement Association the time has come to rebuild our ancient and proud race.

My personal suffering for the program of the Universal Negro Improvement Association is but a drop in the bucket of sacrifice. To correct the evils surrounding our racial existence is to undertake a task as pretentious and difficult as dividing the sea or uprooting the Rock of Gibraltar; but, with the grace of God, all things are possible, for in truth there is prophecy that "Ethiopia shall stretch forth her hand" and "Princes shall come out of Egypt."





Egyptian Dictatorship Called Zaghloul's Goal

LONDON, May 27.—Despite Adly Pasha's difficulties in forming a cabinct in Egypt it still is considered unan attempt himself. It is rumored here that Zaghloul aspires not to premiership, but to a nominal dictatorship, hoping to be a close advisor to the king and government and the power behind the throne. This rather wild dream clearly is the result of the flattering success of the Wafd Party

in the elections. Latest official returns showed that the Zaghloulists returned 160 members, the Liberals thrity-three, Nationalists six, Independents five, Unionists five, with two to be reballotted and three outstanding.

That much is going on behind the scenes is shown by the fact that the decree convoking Parliament has been postponed, while the resignation of Ziwar Pasha, expected this week, may be deferred.

Interracial Commission Outlines Steps for Improvement—Plans of Growth to Be "Mutually Agreeable"

ATLANTA, Ga., May 31,-Recognizing the very great importance of a widespread program of better housing for Negroes, both North and South, the Commission on Interracial Co-operation at its recent annual meeting gave special attention to this subject, and in its findings set forth the following ecommendations:

"Housing is fundamental in the home life of any people, since it intimately affects the health, morals and economic condition of the family. Therefore:

"I. Logical and mutually agreeable plans of growth should be mapped out for Negro neighborhoods in growin

"2. Municipalities should be influenced to develop some of these neigh-borhoods into high class residential sections where homes of which the owners can be proud can be built These neighborhoods should be protected by adequate improvement law and supplied with all city conveniences "3. In order to relieve the conges tion, high rentals and unsanitary conditions of rental sections, private can-
