PARIS.—According to a report from Berlin the Emperor Tafari has bought the Imperial State Coach of the ex-Kaiser. The coach, in all its old time splendor, decorated with the Imperial Abyssinian coat-of-arms rolled through the streets of Berlin on its way to far-off Africa, where it will be used to convey the black emperor to his coronation.

In London also a fashionable Sackville Street tailor is making thirteen bustles or tall bonnets out of as many lion manes. These bustles are to be worn by the Abyssinian princes who will take part in the ceremony. The bustles will be made according to designs drawn by the emperor's own hand. They will have long plumes and into them will be woven the Abyssinian coat-of-arms, representing the Lion of Judah and the Christian Bible. The lions were shot by Tafari, himself.

World's Oldest Nation

The coronation promises to revive some of the splendors of Ethiopia, the oldest nation in the world. When Tafari's ancestors had two thousand years, the ancestors of King George of England, and past and present, were cave men and cannibals. Later Europe became the hunting-ground for slaves by Egyptians and Dutch for slaves and was thus awakened out of her slavery.

Whites Claim Relationship to Blacks
It is not too much to say that Abyssinia is the hope of the black race, despite the fact that since the crushing defeat of the Italians by the forces of Menelik II, the white people are busy claiming ancestry.

Notables Will Meet for Study Of Negro Life

Prominent People to Attend Annual Session of Historical Association

CLEVELAND, O.—From the 26th to the 31st of October the Association for the Study of Negro Life and History, incorporated, will hold its annual meeting in Cleveland, Ohio. The headquarters will be at Cleveland College.

Prominent persons of both races are very much interested in this meeting. Upon the request of Miss Jane E. Hunter of the Phyllis Wheatley Association, and Mr. Alonzo G. Grace, of the Adult Education Association of Cleveland, the Association decided to meet in Cleveland this year. These persons have, therefore, been active in keeping the matter before the thinking elements of the city that a warm welcome and a profitable stay may be assured.

Working to this end, the citizens thus interested have organized a Committee of the Association for the study of Negro life and history, with the Honorable Harry E. Davis as chairman. Other members on this committee are Dr. Ferdinand Q. Blanchard, Mr. Henry M. Busch, Dr. Chas. H. Garvin, Honorable John D. Marshall, Dr. Arthur S. Scott, Mr. Russell W. Jelliffe, Miss Jane E. Hunter, Miss Mildred Chadsey, Mr. Harold T. Clark, Mr. J. E. Cutler, and Attorney Alexander H. Martin.

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British Imperialism In East to Be Buttressed

LONDON, Oct. 16.—Although it was announced only today that a committee of the Imperial Conference had been appointed to discuss the future of the Singapore naval base, it seemed common property in dominion circles late tonight that the MacDonald Government had given its assent to pushing the work on this \$45,000,000 undertaking. If this is true it is the first unanimous decision the conference has reached.

About \$15,000,000 has been spent on the base which includes a dry dock large enough to accommodate the biggest British battleship and an extensive air station. New Zealand, which is one of the strongest advocates of the base, has already contributed \$5,000,000 and the other dominions have contributed about \$5,000,000.

College Girls Stoned Out of Lodging Place

Premeditated Attack by Prejudiced White Mob Who Disappear

GREELEY, Colo.—Following a deliberate and carefully planned attack on their lodging-place on College Hill, during which one shot was fired into the structure and nearly every window in the place was broken, the house-mother and six girl students of Colorado Teachers College have been forced to seek other abode in this prejudiced-permeated town of 11,000 persons.

Showing Premeditation
To the girls, the attack was a startling surprise, for they had not the least intimation of the storm that was gathering over their very heads, although it has been learned that a white man had called earlier on in the week and told the house-mother, Mrs. Carrie Nesley, that the neighbors objected to their (Negroes) presence in the neighborhood, and to get out or expect trouble; they were also unaware of an "indignation meeting" of the property owners that had been held to protest the girls' presence in the district. Those who attended the meeting denied any knowledge of the attack, although it is a significant fact, that all during the attack and afterwards, not one resident appeared.

Big Gains Claimed By Brazil Rebels

Federal Regiment Is Reported Taken in Minas Gerais—40 Companies Won Over

PORTO ALEGRE, Oct. 16.—Progress in the state of Minas Gerais, with the surrender of an entire regiment of federal infantry and claims of the defection of large federal forces to the insurgents, was reported in an official rebel communique today. The communique stated that a heavy concentration of troops was in progress along the Parana-Sao Paulo frontier, a region where the federal and insurgent armies have been gathering for the last few days for what has been anticipated as a major engagement. Observers today, in fact, expressed the opinion that the present gathering of troops along this line was the greatest concentration that had ever been seen in South America.

While not stating the number of soldiers involved, the insurgents made the claim that sixty companies of federals at Catarina had gone over to the revolution. These men were said to be under the command of Capt. Mario Carvalho. Two machine guns and much more material were taken over.

The federal regiment reported to have surrendered was described as the 11th Infantry, stationed in the state of Minas Gerais. It had been surrounded by the insurgents and surrender was said to be without condition.

FELLOWMEN OF THE NEGRO RACE, Greeting:

As we move along the by-paths of life we find that we have each and everyone of us some work to do. That work we must carefully attend to if we are to make a success of it.

As We Look Back

No sober, intelligent and reasonable human being wants to be a failure in life, yet so many of us fail because we lack the courage to endure and execute the work that we

should be called to do. Those of us who find our work and make up our minds to execute it, generally have the satisfaction to look back upon our careers and see progress all along the line.

The Success of Life

Great can be the result of our tackling our work in the spring time of life, working consistently and determinedly through the summer up to the autumn, then in our mature selves, we survey the pleasant avenues through which we have traveled, and say "well done." How grand and glorious a thing it is for a man in the autumn of his life to look back and see success everywhere. This should be the aim of every man; but to achieve this means that we must work hard and consistently. Some of us throw away such golden opportunities through our changeable and varied dispositions.

Do Not Falter

We all should, before we start out on our careers, determine just what we are to be, what kind of work we are going to engage ourselves in, and as Nixon Waterman suggests, "Do not falter or shrink; but just think out your work."

Abyssinia Rulers to Don Crowns At Dawn After Night of Prayer

ADDIS ABABA, Abyssinia, Oct. 19.—The Negus Ras Tafari of Abyssinia and his queen, Walzeru Menen, who will be crowned Emperor and Empress of Abyssinia Nov. 2, will spend the entire preceding night in solemn meditation and prayer at St. George's Cathedral.

Outside, thousands of Abyssinian Christians, subjects of the "King of Kings and Lion of Judah," will stand during the vigil holding lighted candles, sacred images and ecclesiastical banners.

Within the dark cloistered walls of the famous church, built by the Emperor Menelik as a thank-offering for the victory of the Abyssinians over Italian troops in 1896, the two sovereigns throughout the night will invoke the blessings of Heaven upon their reign, their people and their country.

As dawn breaks through the inner sanctuary of coronation day their majesties, clad in gorgeous robes of crimson velvet embroidered with gold and set with diamonds, will be crowned by the Coptic archbishop, assisted by six other bishops. The archbishop and the bishops will pronounce a Te Deum in the "Geez" language, which is the ancient ecclesiastical tongue of Abyssinia. The crowns today repose on a high altar in the church, the six bishops praying over them for twenty-one days before the coronation. The precious stones and gold with which they are set were purchased in Europe and made by master goldsmiths of the country at a cost of \$1,000,000.



Dr. Charles S. Johnson, professor of sociology at Fisk University, and the American Commissioner investigating charges of alleged slavery and enforced labor in Liberia, arrived in New York Monday, October 13, on the S. S. Leviathan after seven months in Liberia. Mr. Johnson was accompanied by his secretary, John P. Mathews, of West Virginia State College.

The report was submitted simultaneously at Washington, to the League of Nations, at Geneva, and to the Liberian government at Monrovia. Mr. Johnson refused to state what the nature of his report would be, preferring to let the government make this public announcement.

Dr. Johnson is in the best of health and spirit and the commission stated that his only ailment during his seven months in Africa was a strain on his eyes. Mr. Mathews was also in good health.

The good health was attributed largely to their mental and physical activity. Most people come from America, and labor so cheap they are able to pay someone to supply money for their needs, and a consequence have little physical work to do. Instead of making great exertion on their trips of investigation they walked most of the 144 miles.

White Mother Lied To Save Son's Fate

Told Mob Husband Slain by Black Complexioned Man—Innocent Lad Saved

HUNTSVILLE, Ala.—How near another Alabama mob came to executing its vengeance on an innocent suspect was revealed here last week when state law enforcement officers arrested Thomas Ross, and another white man, and charged them with killing the father of Ross, a crime for which G. H. Henderson had been held as a suspect.

Henderson was saved from mob violence only when state militia drove away a blood thirsty crowd of white men with bayonets and tear bombs. He was taken to Birmingham and lodged in the Jefferson County jail for safe keeping.

Killed Father

Evidence, said to be conclusive, reveals that the elder H. E. Ross was killed by his son Thomas and J. F. Matheny, the latter a foreman in the Ross dry cleaning establishment, when he surprised them in his room trying to steal the company's funds.

According to the story which formed the basis for the arrest, the two white men, son and foreman, went to the father's home while the latter was away. When Ross returned and found the men in his bedroom where the day's receipts were kept until banking day, a fight ensued during which the elder man was killed.

Henderson a Suspect

To Burn "Passes," Badges of Slavery In South Africa

CAPETOWN, So. A.—It is not too early to begin preparations for Dingaan's Day. Demonstrations this year must be on a larger scale than ever before. A serious assault must be made on the Pass Laws. The burning of these badges of slavery will be the chief event on Dingaan's Day. At the same time effective protests must be made against the Poll Tax; the civil disobedience campaign of refusal to pay blood money to a tyrant government will receive further impetus. Begin to organize now! All out on the streets on Dingaan's Day! Join in the pass-burners' campaign! Refuse to pay Poll Tax! Down with the slave-drivers' government! Long live the Native Republic! Mayibuye!

Other Three Stores in Negro Section Also to Employ Some

CHICAGO—Changing a policy of over fifty years' standing, the F. W. Woolworth company announced Saturday that it had employed twenty-one colored salesgirls to work in its newly-opened store located at Fifty-first street and Calumet avenue.

The announcement of the employment of colored clerks was made by William J. Rand, district superintendent for the company.

Mr. Rand also announced that colored salesgirls would be placed in the other three Southside stores of the Woolworth company as fast as they could be trained for the work.

Result of Job Campaign
The breaking down of this fifty-year-old policy of the Woolworth company is one result of the campaign of the Chicago Whip, Southside weekly paper, to get Negroes to spend money only where they can get jobs. The Whip's campaign has been in progress for almost one year and during that time it is claimed nearly 2,000 new jobs have been opened up to colored people on the Southside in stores where the patronage is mostly colored.

One by one the chain stores on the Southside gave in to the reasonable request that they hire some members of the race from which the stores get most of their patronage. Chain drug stores, chain grocery stores and meat markets, branch stores and others hired Negroes.

Seventeen Weeks Picket

Seventeen weeks ago a picket was started outside the three Woolworth stores catering to colored trade. Steadily the pickets marched before the stores with their signs. This (Continued on Page Eight)

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Morocco Cheers Doumergue On His Visit

French President Promises Customs, Traditions

PARIS, Oct. 15.—A proposal that France renounce all changes in its government, should adhere to a policy of non-interference in the affairs of other nations, was made by President Doumergue when he landed at Casablanca, Morocco, yesterday by Sultan Moulay Mohammed on an official visit.

A heavy rain retarded the President's arrival three hours, during which many orations on the reception committee paid gold for a glass of water as they stood under a brooding sun, where only the Sultan was seated.

President Doumergue was received with great enthusiasm by natives and colonists alike, and his path from the bathhouse to the Governor's residence and thence to the Sultan's palace was strewn with rich carpets that his feet did not touch the earth on the pavement. The French President was acclaimed by a great throng and accompanied by detachment of the inner units of the colonial troops.

After a warm greeting from the young Sultan, President Doumergue delivered an address praising the progress made in Morocco under French rule.

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Garveyism Bears Fruit

GARVEYISM is now bearing fruit, not only in far and near corners of our beloved continent, but also in all parts of the Western Hemisphere. It is a significant fact whether seen of the middle-aged Negro leaders know it or not.

An epoch-making thing has happened in Chicago. The Woodworth chain stores that had made it a policy not to employ Negro girls on their sales force for the last fifty years have now been forced to reverse it. The reason is that Negroes of Chicago followed a courageous leadership with a sustained spirit and effort and effectively boycotted the Woodworth stores. Short-sighted Negroes were forced to fall in line by constant picketing.

We hasten to compliment the able organizers of this movement, chief among whom is The Chicago Woman. We also compliment the Negroes of Chicago for their racial consciousness and solidarity and for their willingness and fearlessness in following their leaders.

While all credit for the local success in Chicago is due to the leaders on the spot an analysis will show that historically the tribute is due to Garveyism alone. If Garveyism had not aroused the Negroes of America to self-consciousness, if it had not taught them that they must fight, not for the so-called social equality but for economic independence, if it had not preached to them to stick together and fight their battle as one, we wonder whether there would have been even a courageous boycott like the one in Chicago is a great eye-opener for the Negro all over the world. That the Woodworth management has employed some Negro salesgirls in one of its stores is in itself not much to blow our horn about. But the incident shows the Negro what he can do if he is determined to do it. And it serves notice upon the white employers that they must learn to play fair with the Negro if they mean to make money out of him.

The economic law is its inflexible inviolability. In international trade you cannot keep on selling without buying, nor can you keep on buying without selling. The same law is valid in national and domestic economy also. You cannot spend without earning, nor can you spend without earning. If the Negro is to be paid he can only spend liberally. If he is ill paid or it is not of work the business man is the loser in the end. Why not adopt the policy of square deal toward the Negro all over the country?

Will the other leading Negro centers follow suit? Will they organize as effectively as the Negroes in Chicago? It is not hard. Garveyism has aroused the same racial consciousness all over the country, and if a courageous leadership comes forth it will find the response of a courageous following. This surely is one of the weapons whereby the Negro as a group can seek common justice in this prejudicial, rotten country.

"Making the Natives Fit"

THE NAVY, the imperialists the world over are protesting that they are "ruling, not exploiting" the natives for their own good. They further claim that as soon as they train the natives to be fit to manage their own affairs they will relax their control and let the natives govern themselves.

Among the imperialists the British proclaim this philosophy the loudest. They have been arrogantly calling their Parliament the mother of all political wisdom. A representative government is supposed to be a peculiar contribution of the so-called Anglo-Saxon race, which has unfolded from precedent to precedent, as the phrase goes. And the British boast that they are teaching the natives in the four corners of this earth the benefits of representative government.

Let us see if the natives of Africa know anything about this system of government of the Anglo-Saxon. A Mr. H. S. Nevills, the Acting Secretary for Native Affairs on the Gold Coast, tells us:

"It is asked by the expert whether Britain whether a body composed solely of chiefs can be fairly regarded as a representative of a democratic people. The answer is that it is not. The Gold Coast native is not fit to be taught this system of government. Long before Christ Columbus and Bartholomew Diaz visited the Gold Coast in 1482, Sovereignty in the Gold Coast tribes lies in the people themselves, who elect their chiefs, and who can, if they so desire, deprive them of office. Each chief is, in fact, . . . but the mouthpiece of his State Council, without whose approval no chief can perform any executive or judicial act. . . . It was well said by one of the head chiefs, recently that 'when you are installed as a chief you become the humblest servant of the State; you are absolutely under the influence and guidance of your councilors, so that there is nothing whatever to fear as to the powers of a chief without a check.'"

And still the white man thinks of teaching the natives the blessings of representative government. He already knows it.

Watch Your Step, Abyssinia!

IT is very commendable that Abyssinia, one of the oldest monarchies in the world, and the greatest Negro independent nation today, should strive to modernize itself and thus establish a leading and powerful government and shine in the comity of nations. The Negroes the world over justly pride themselves on the present glorious position of their country.

Abyssinia has undertaken under the present Emperor, Haile Selassie, a program of modernization in its fighting forces, its agriculture, its health service, its finance, its education and every other governmental activity. The Emperor is securing modern arms and airplanes. He has undertaken to build a great dam across the Blue Nile to tap agriculture. He has sought the help of the American Negroes to organize a health service for the empire. He has obtained the services of two white Americans to advise the departments of education and finance.

Moreover, Abyssinia has shown shrewd statesmanship in seeking its friends from America. The Abyssinian government cannot afford to risk either the British, French, Italian or German empires for the empire and their record in Africa is spotted with dismal disaster. And Britain, France and Italy have been looking at Abyssinia with an evil and greedy eye. To invite experts from these countries is to invite national disaster.

But the case of America is in some way different. The United States
